COLD WEATHER HUMIDITY CHALLENGES

Many of you face this challenge every winter during cold snaps, the humidity level in your operating rooms drop below the acceptable level. This drop in humidity can increase the risk of a surgical fire. Also, some equipment and supplies can be negatively affected by low humidity levels.

I thought of a way to mitigate this issue and after speaking with a few of my colleagues, who are more knowledgeable on HVAC than myself, I decided to present this idea to the group. My idea is to run the humidity level up towards the top of your acceptable range before a cold front comes into the area. The hope is that we can maintain the humidity level within the acceptable range throughout the duration of the cold front. If your organization decides to give this idea a try this winter, please report the outcome to the group.
